Heli flyers - for the next 4-6 weeks, we will trial hovering only at the North end of the field, regardless of wind. Of course, if no one else is on the field, use it. Aircraft flyers - watch for helis at the North end.

Most of the meeting revolved around planning for the airshow. VMAA approval has been granted. Everything else looks ready to roll. 3 Signs will be printed listing all the sponsors and put on display, along with a table of our sponsors business cards. I collected the Blackhorse Mosquito from Hastings Hobbies on the 14th of October with much anticipation and excitement. Always had a soft spot for the mossy....and the spitty, and the hurricane etc, etc.

My first immediate concern, would the box fit in the car, it's a big box, and my car isn't the most appropriate size for this hobby (I must do something about that one day). Success, but gear changes were a little annoying with a huge obstruction next to my left hand.

Now the first glaring error that I became aware of after having opened and spread every thing out, was the arrangement of the pilots, side by side, Com's and Nav officer sat to the right and behind the pilots position. They also had very large wide eye's almost in fear of some impending doom. Nothing I can do about the eye's, but I could do something about their seating position, Surgery, scrub, scalpel, steel ruler, band aids close by.

This surgical process required a little thought, however after some consideration, surgery turned to butchery. I had thought removal of the canopy was my answer, however this would of created a further mess with film covering, final option was to attack from below, cutting the cockpit floor panel out, in one piece.





After this I now had access to the pilots, switching their positions was the next step, as said this was butchery in a gentle form, Murphy and I appear to be very close friends and as a result I managed to damage the cockpit floor that I had cut out to the point that it was RS, This I was able to replace with some balsa, I even inserted backrests. Inspired by Tony Smith and his efforts and even painted their Mae West's in yellow. Reinserted the new floor panel with repositioned pilots and now much happier with the end result.


I have this OS 55AX in mint condition, run for about 1 hour, but now have no use for it.
