Pylon Rules by Keith

WPMAC RULES FOR 46 PYLON RACING

Aircraf t Rules

The aircraft must be 46 size high wing trainer. With the following modifications only allowed:

- Any size & make prop
- Any make or type of fuel
- Any make of engine (must be 46 size with no modifications)
- Must comply with WPMAC noise limits.

Race Rules

1 X Pilot 1 X Co-Pilot (scorer)

Race duration 30 minutes with one compulsory pit stop at any time. The aircraft completing the most circuits of the course in that time, will be the winner.

You can change pilots any time.

When pit stop occurs you must take off and pass The first pylon or no lap recorded.


A triangular course is flown around 3 pylons.

The race will start with all aircraft lined up on the starting line next to the pilots box. Wind permitting, the first leg will be flown away from the pilot box (NW direction) towards the middle pylon.

The lap counter doesn't start until the aircraft first passes the pilot. So the lap following this becomes lap 1. etc..

If your engine cuts out during the race, you can make a normal dead stick landing. But you MUST make it as far as the starting line if you wish to continue that race. Otherwise you must wait for that race to finish before collecting the plane.

Any pilot who wishes to challenge another pilot must Tell the Events Director between races.

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


Web Site Updates
