Failsafe on Models

Hi All

It has come to my attention there are members at our club not setting their fail safes on their models. (Min setting, throttle set to low).

I can't stress to you enough regarding the safety factor of not setting your failsafe. If you don't understand how it works or how to set it up in your radio ask someone.

I have spectrum and futaba so if you need to know how to set it up come and see me.

With Spectrum when you first bind your plane throttle must be set at low, as Spectrum has a failsafe called smartsafe failsafe.

It knows where the throttle is set once you bind your model, but when you are setting up all your controls and you find that the throttle is working in reverse, once you reverse it to operate the right way you MUST THEN RE-BIND your model so it knows your throttle is set at low





Pylon Racing on the Mornington Peninsula

WPMAC - Western Port Model Aircraft Club located in the seaside town of Crib Point hosted no doubt now one of the best Sports 40 and Quickie 500 races in the calendar. Crib Point is the home of HMAS Cerberus and is the Royal Australian Navy's primary training establishment with history dating back to 1911, now trains 6000 personnel annually with about 800 trainees onboard at any one time.

On Saturday Oct. 8th. Crib Point Community House invited WPMAC to use their Sausage Sizzle setup at their monthly community market.

We took up the offer and although we hadn't done an outside catering event like this before, armed ourselves with plenty of food, and with Gibbo and Rose doing the cooking, Brian and Hardy taking the orders and myself putting the orders together, we had a very successful day. Selling egg and bacon sandwiches, sausages in bread and soft drinks, we had sales of around \$500 and cleared around \$300 profit.

When fitting mufflers to your two stroke glow engines, don't use the supplied paper gasket, these settle with heat and allow the fixing bolts to come loose. Go metal to metal with a thin film of sealant, PERMATEX ULTRA COPPER is ideal and use Loctite and/or spring washers on the bolts.

Also don't over tighten the centre bolt through the muffler as these break with heat. Tighten them just enough to hold the muffler together, lock the lock nut up hard and burr the exposed thread so it cannot come off resulting in losing the rear of the muffler.

If you do lose part of your muffler, wait till Gibbo does the mowing and listen for the "chink".
